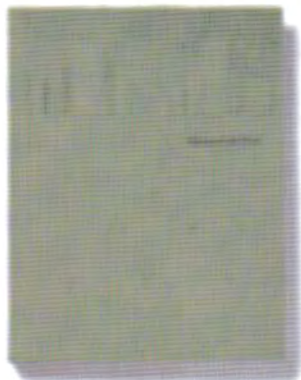

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### 3 OF THE BEST... DESIGN BOOKS



Released to coincide with the opening of the 'Edmond de Waal: Atmosphere' exhibition at the Turner Contemporary gallery, new book *Edmond de Waal* (Phaidon, £29.95) is an overview of the potter and sculptor's work. There are essays by Deborah Sussat (who designed de Waal's London studios), novelist and poet AS Byatt and even de Waal himself, who is not only a maker of beautiful, hand-thrown porcelain vessels, but a ceramics historian and author too.



Launched more than a decade ago by Seyhan Özdemir and Sefer Çağlar, Turkish studio Autoban has undertaken interior design projects around the world, from restaurants and hotels to retail spaces. Coffee-table tome *Autoban* (Gestalten, £45) presents the highlights of the company's portfolio.



*Lucienne Day* by Andrew Casey (Antique Collectors Club, £29.95) is devoted to one of Britain's greatest post-war textile designers. Starting with Day's childhood, it follows her life and career from her breakthrough Festival of Britain 'Calyx' print to her relationship with department store H&M's and later designs for ceramics and wallpapers.



### PAINT TO PAPER

Anyone familiar with Gloucestershire artist and florist Su Daybell's paintings will recognise her hand in this new 'Force 9' wallpaper for British interiors company Lewis & Wood. The marble-effect design is sold as a dramatic double-width wallcovering in two panels. £141 per panel ([lewisandwood.co.uk](http://lewisandwood.co.uk)).

The colourful new collection by British glassmaker Bob Crooks features pineapple-shaped perfume bottles and large decanters with spiralled stoppers. Each piece is handmade at Crooks' studio in Devon and plays on the natural characteristics of glass, such as reflectiveness, opacity and transparency.
