## Self-Sufficient Sprouter

To develop indoor growing kit Microgarden, Swedish design studio Tomorrow Machine teamed up with Berlin-based Infarm, a start-up specializing in the production of customized indoor farming systems for various locations and occasions. Tomorrow Machine's foldable mini greenhouse, made from reusable plastic, features a gelatinous seaweed that serves as a growth medium. Transparent packaging and clear agar-agar enable users to watch the seeds sprout. Even those without a green thumb can enjoy the self-sufficient hydroponic product, which relies on water absorbed from the gel to nurture 'microgreens' and other seedlings. — CB

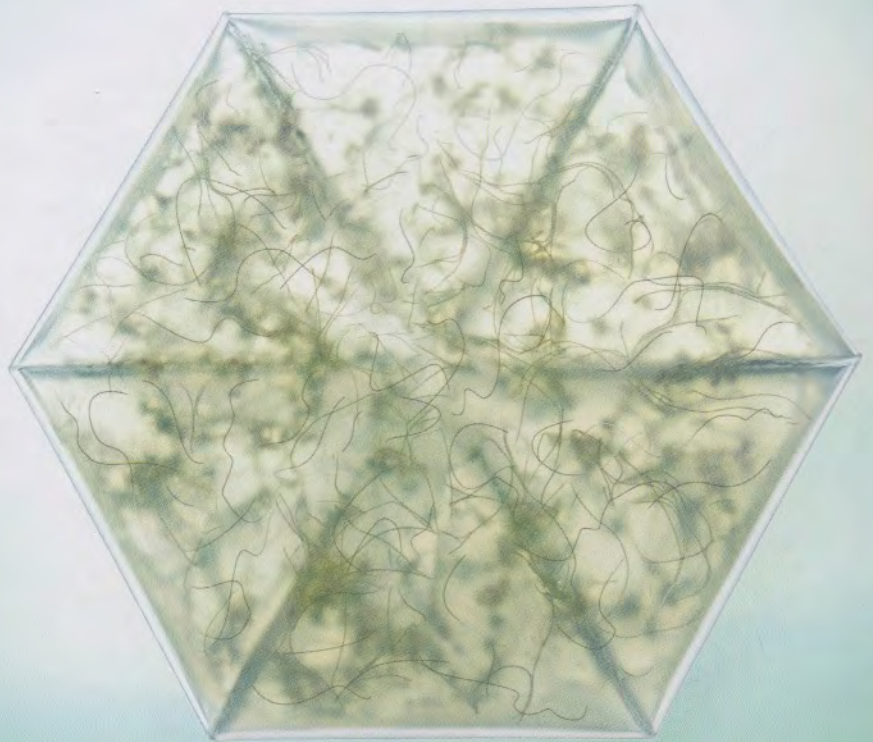
